

2010 Commonwealth Games Team Selection Policy

The following selection policy is to nominate the Shooting members for the Australian Commonwealth Games Association Team to the 2010 Commonwealth Games to be held in India.

1. The team selected will compete in the specified events being;

○ Men's Trap	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's Skeet	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's Double Trap	2	(individual and team)
○ Women's Trap	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's 50m Pistol (Free)	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's Air Pistol	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's 25m Pistol (Rapid)	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's Centre Fire Pistol	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's Standard Pistol	2	(individual and team)
○ Women's 25m Pistol (Sport)	2	(individual and team)
○ Women's Air Pistol	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's Air Rifle	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's 3 x 40	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's Air Rifle	2	(individual and team)
○ Men's Prone	2	(individual and team)
○ Women's 3x20	2	(individual and team)
○ Women's Air rifle	2	(individual and team)
○ Women's Prone	2	(individual and team)
○ Full Bore Rifle	2	(individual and team) see NRAA
2. All event teams comprise of 2 persons, and the total team size will be accordance with the overall constraints as directed by the ACGA.
3. The selection events will be open to
 - a. those listed in the top ten of the AISL Ranking List in the event they are contesting, with the exception of Men's Trap, at the close of entries to the first selection event and
 - b. those listed in the top twenty of the Men's Trap AISL Ranking List at the close of entries to the first selection event and
 - c. up to two wild cards in each event, except for Men's Trap, which will be issued by the AISL High Performance Management Committee.
4. No athlete is eligible to be chosen as a member of the Commonwealth Games Team unless the athlete has signed the AISL Consent to Consideration for Nomination and provided it to the Australian International Shooting Ltd Chief Executive Officer. Parental signature will be required for those under 18. These forms will be available on the web for information and will be sent to those listed in the top ten at the relevant date.
5. Athletes must be a registered and financial member of Australian Clay Target Association or Pistol Australia or Target Rifle Australia or National Rifle Australia Association;
6. The Selection Panel shall:
 - (i) only nominate those athletes it honestly believes have met the requirements described in the Selection Criteria;
 - (ii) only nominate those athletes who have signed the athlete nomination form issued by the ACGA from time to time;
 - (iii) not nominate athletes who have breached the AISL/ACGA Anti-Doping Policy and have had a sanction imposed which has not been completed;

7. Nomination of Athletes

- a) The Team will be nominated to the Australian Commonwealth Games Association as a result of the following process. Three selection Events in each discipline will be conducted to enable competitors to be ranked.

- b) Ranking will be determined by the aggregate of the two highest scores (without the finals) from the competitions listed above.
- The athlete with the highest aggregate score from their two highest scores at the nomination competitions will be ranked first.
 - Where there are two or more shooters with a tied aggregate score from their two highest scores then the tie will be broken by a shoot off round conducted under ISSF finals conditions.
 - In the unlikely event that a tie still exists then it will be broken by a miss and out shoot off under ISSF tie break rules
 - All shoot offs for team placing will be conducted prior to the final of the last selection competition.
 - If two or more athletes have equal aggregate scores from their two highest scores in non-Olympic events; then the tie will be broken by ISSF Rules.
- c) After the conclusion of the third nomination competition the AISL Selection Panel will nominate the two athletes in each event to the ACGA to compete at the Commonwealth Games 2010 in India by:
- The first ranked athletes in each event from the nomination competitions will be selected automatically,
 - the second athlete will be selected by the AISL Selection Panel in its absolute discretion from the second and third ranked athletes following the conclusion of the three nomination competitions.
- d) In using its discretion the AISL Selection Panel will make any decision based on athletes' performance and selecting the strongest possible medal chance in each event. Past performance at international competitions will also be taken in consideration for each of athletes.
