

Privacy Policy

Australian International Shooting Limited

The Australian International Shooting Limited has adopted the guidelines as attached in conformity with The Commonwealth *Privacy Amendment (Private Sector) Act 2000* and in force from 21 December 2001.

In summary, the principles provide that AISL:

- Must ensure its collection of personal information is fair and lawful. An organisation must tell a person why the information is being collected and that they have a right of access to that information (NPP 1);
- Is to use information only for the purpose for which it was collected, unless the individual has consented or any secondary purpose is so reasonably related to the primary purpose, that a reasonable person would expect it to be used for the secondary purpose (NPP 2);
- Must take reasonable steps to ensure that the information collected is accurate and up to date (NPP 3);
- Must take reasonable steps to protect the personal information it holds for misuse or loss (NPP 4);
- Must have a policy which sets out its information handling practices (NPP 5);
- Must give individuals access to their personal information it holds subject to the request creating an unreasonable administrative burden or expense (NPP 6);
- Must not adopt, use or disclose, an identifier that has been assigned by a Commonwealth government agency (NPP 7);
- Must give individuals the option to interact anonymously where it is lawful and practical to do so (NPP 8);
- Can only transfer personal information to a recipient in a foreign country in circumstances where the information will have appropriate protection (NPP 9);
- Must not collect sensitive information unless the individual has consented or in other special specified circumstances (ie. public health and safety) (NPP 10).
