

AISL Selection Criteria: ISSF World Championships 2010

The following is published to enable all to understand the process for the Team Selection for the World Championships in Munich - Germany.

1. The Team for the 2010 ISSF World Championships will be selected from the three Selection competitions in Olympic events for each discipline:

Clay Target	1. ACTA National Championships	18-24 Jan 2010 Brisbane
	2. AISL Australia Cup Open	5-7 Feb 2010 Sydney
	3. AISL Australia Cup Open	26-28 Mar 2010 Melbourne

2. Ranking will be determined by the aggregate of the two highest scores (without the Finals) from the Competitions listed above.
 - a. Where there are two or more shooters with a tied aggregate score from their two highest scores then the tie will be broken by a shoot off round conducted under ISSF finals conditions.
 - b. In the unlikely event that a tie still exists then it will be broken by a miss and out shoot off under ISSF tie break rules.
 - c. All shoot offs for team placing will be conducted prior to the final of the last selection competition.
 - d. If two or more athletes have equal aggregate scores from their two highest scores in non Olympic events; then the tie will be broken by ISSF Rules.
3. Those athletes ranked in the top three in each event will be considered for selection to the AISL Team for the World Championships if they have achieved the Performance Qualifying Scores (PQS) at least twice in the period of 6th June 2009 – and the completion of the third selection event; with one PQS score being not older than 6 months at the end of the third selection event.
4. If the team is not fully selected by cl.3, the AISL Selection Panel reserves the right to additionally select AISL High Performance Squad athletes who have achieved high scores regularly, but who may not have achieved the PQS.
5. The AISL Selection Panel will in their absolute discretion select in the team junior athletes complying with ISSF rules.
6. The AISL Selection Panel may decide to enter selected team member to compete in other events if allowed by the ISSF competitions rules.
7. The final AISL Team for the World Championships will be announced May 31st, 2010.
8. AISL will cover the travel, accommodation and entry fees for the Team competing in Olympic events, subject to funding available.
9. Athletes may be entered in the non Olympic events on a self funding basis.
10. AISL may decide to enter selected athletes in Olympic events on a part or self funding basis.
11. The AISL selection panel in using its *Absolute Discretion will base its judgement on rankings and international performances*

Note: funding commitments are subject to funds being available
